

August 2021 Quality Improvement Program – New Jersey (QIP-NJ) Announcements & Updates

Dear QIP-NJ Participants,

Welcome to the QIP-NJ newsletter! Measurement Year (MY) 1 of QIP-NJ officially launched on July 1, 2021 and will run through December 31, 2021. The Department of Health (DOH) encourages you to review this newsletter to help ensure you stay up-to-date on important news and announcements regarding QIP-NJ. As always, all newsletters will be posted to the QIP-NJ Documents & Resources webpage within approximately one week of distribution.

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DOH Corner

Now that participating hospitals are almost two months into MY1 of QIP-NJ, DOH wants to again acknowledge the helpful engagement and feedback from so many of our hospital partners relative to various QIP-NJ processes and policies. DOH recognizes the value of real-time hospital input as the QIP-NJ team continually engages in a cycle of refinement and process improvement to help ensure QIP-NJ is successful. To that end, DOH requests that participating hospitals be mindful of the various deliverables and deadlines associated with

MY1 and to proactively reach out to the QIP-NJ team if experiencing any challenges and/or there is a need for one-on-one technical assistance.

In addition, DOH is pleased to announce that on August 10, 2021, the QIP-NJ team extended a warm welcome to both new and existing members of the Quality Measures Committee (QMC). In the most recent cycle of nominations, DOH added five new experts to the QMC from the following hospitals and/or hospital systems: Hackensack Meridian Health Network, Robert Wood Johnson Barnabas Health, Jefferson Health, Saint Clare's Hospital—Dover, St, Joseph's Health, and Bergen New Bridge Medical Center. Over the next approximately twelve months, DOH will be engaging QMC members in two meetings in which they will provide critical input on the measurement strategy for QIP-NJ, as well as review performance results to help identify successes and areas for improvement.

Reminder: Non-Claims Based Measure Submission Deadline

Non-claims-based measure submissions for the QIP-NJ baseline period (July 1, 2020 – December 31, 2020) are due by 5:00 PM EST on Monday, September 30, 2021. Hospitals are required to submit data for all non-claims-based measures via the Standard Reporting Template and/or flat file and upload the appropriate files to the hospital's "Outbound" folder on the QIP-NJ SFTP. The Standard Reporting Template and Non-Claims-Based Performance Measure Data Submissions Guidance Document are available on the Participants & Stakeholders webpage of the QIP-NJ website. Please email QIP-NJ@pcqus.com with any questions about this process. While DOH expects hospital submissions by this deadline, the QIP-NJ team recognizes that occasionally individual hospitals may require additional time. As a result, individual hospitals requests for extensions may also be submitted to QIP-NJ@pcqus.com, and they will be considered on a case-by-case basis for approval.

Reminder: Test File Submission Deadline

DOH would like to remind hospitals of the upcoming deadline for test file submission to the QIP-NJ SFTP. If your hospital wishes to submit a test flat file or test Excel template, please contact the QIP-NJ team prior to August 30, 2021 via the QIP-NJ inbox to schedule your test submission. The goal of the test file submission process is to provide an opportunity for hospitals, in advance of the 9/30 deadline, with any critical data issues to mitigate risks of errors prior to the final "real data" (production) submission. Although the State is not requiring the test file, it is strongly encouraged to ensure a seamless data submission process. Hospitals do not need to send the entirety of their data; rather, a representative sample of formatted data (e.g., a few patients per performance measure) is acceptable.

Now Available: Chart Based Measure Specification Webinars

On July 30, 2021, DOH published a series of recorded chart-based measure specification webinars to help hospitals understand how to calculate

performance for all QIP-NJ chart-based measures. These six webinars can be found on the QIP-NJ Documents & Resources webpage. The webinars address behavioral health (BH) measures BH7, BH8, and BH9, as well as maternal health measures M2, M3, M6 and M7 (note that the information for BH9 is contained within the M6 webinar). Reminder: Statewide Total Attribution Numbers Available on the QIP-NJ Secure File Transfer Portal (SFTP)

DOH released the statewide total numbers of Medicaid Managed Care (MMC) enrolled individuals attributed for the behavioral health (BH) and maternal health components of QIP-NJ for the baseline period to all participating QIP-NJ hospitals via email on August 2, 2021. In addition, this information is available

in hospitals' "Inbound" folder of the <u>QIP-NJ SFTP</u>. Please note that this is information was provided to all participating hospitals for both historical context as well as to assist hospitals with projecting their share of total attribution for each MY. Hospitals may use this information, as needed, to project their potential funding based on individual hospital baseline attribution and statewide totals for baseline attribution.

Learning Collaborative August Update

DOH is pleased to share that 50 hospitals have elected to participate in the BH Learning Collaborative. A list of participating hospitals can be found below. The Collaborative leadership team is working to set up one-on-one coaching sessions with participating hospitals in advance of Learning Session #1, which will take place on September 22nd and 23rd.
