We are now approximately two months into MY 4 of QIP-NJ, which began in January and will run through the end of the year. As shared in last month's newsletter, DOH received approval for MY 4 of QIP-NJ from CMS at the end of December.

Important: MY 2 Results and Payment Advice

On February 16, 2024, final MY 2 measurement results were communicated to participating hospitals along with MY 3 targets and made available via hospitals' SFTP. Additionally, the QIP-NJ team anticipates that MY 2 payment amounts, and guidance will be communicated to Medicaid Managed Care

Organizations (MMCOs) and hospitals in March. Earlier this month, QIP-NJ program leads were notified that due to payment calculation delays, the QIP-NJ team anticipates that MY 2 payments will be issued by MMCOs within the second quarter.

LOI 4 Submission and Verification

MY 4 LOI materials were distributed in December and required all NJ acute care hospitals to affirmatively respond indicating whether they intend to participate in MY 4 of QIP-NJ. The LOI process included a Medicaid ID/billing provider NPI validation section and DOH is working with DHS to verify that appropriate IDs are captured for purposes of MY 3 reporting.

Coming Soon: MY 3 and 4 Databook, SRT, and VSC Updates

The QIP-NJ team is currently finalizing version 3.1 of the MY 3 Databook, Standard Reporting Template (SRT) and SRT Guide, and Value Set Compendium which will be necessary for MY 3 reporting later this year. The QIP-NJ team is also developing in tandem MY 4 draft versions of these documents for hospitals' review. Both sets of documents will be posted to the QIP-NJ website in early March and an announcement will be sent to QIP-NJ program leads informing them of their availability.

Other State Initiatives and Programs

- Advanced Life Support in Obstetrics (ALSO) training is an
 evidence-based training used by birthing providers and
 interprofessional maternity care teams to handle obstetric
 emergencies. NJ DOH encourages teams to look into the components

- The Nurture NJ Strategic Plan, which aims to make NJ the safest and most equitable place in the national to deliver and raise a baby. Please check the <u>Nurture NJ website</u> for more information and to discover new ways to become engaged.
- The NJ Maternal Care Quality Collaborative (NJMCQC) aims to achieve a significant and sustained improvement in overall maternal and infant morbidity and mortality rates statewide. The final public meeting for this year was held in December 2023. • DHS' Episode of Care (EOC) Pilot is a three-year pilot to test a new alternative payment model for prenatal, labor, and postpartum services statewide. More information regarding the EOC Pilot can be found on DHS' website at the link below. Performance Period 1 (15 months) of the EOC Pilot ran from April 1, 2022 through June 30, 2023. Performance Period 2 (12 months) began on July 1, 2023 and will run through June 30, 2024. Performance Period 3 (12 months) will run from July 1, 2024 through June 30, 2025.
