MY 2 Data Submission Webinar Feedback and Updated Guidance

Thank you to the numerous hospital teams and other individuals who attended the MY 2 Data Submission Best Practices Webinar and Guidance session. During the session, the QIP-NJ Team covered key updates for MY 2 reporting and took questions. As a follow-up, we sent a brief three-question poll to QIP-NJ Program Leads to refine the reporting requirements for measures M7 and M10/BH12. Based on feedback from participating hospital teams and their partners, QIP-NJ is making the following adjustments for MY 2 reporting:

- M7: Simplified reporting requirements for First Line Agent (FLA) administration for numerator-eligibility. Hospitals will be able to report which of the approved FLAs was used and will not need to consult the list of NDC codes in the VSC nor FDA website
- M10/BH12: Refined denominator data variable requirements
 - o 'Gender' and 'Date of Birth' are no longer required
 - o Instead, 'EmployeeID' or a unique trackable employee-specific ID are required

Additionally, the QIP-NJ Team has made already approved updates/clarifications regarding the following:

- M3/BH7: As approved during QMC 8, screening tools and response options have been updated
- BH7: the exclusion criteria have been clarified
- M6: A number of <u>procedure</u> codes will be enabled to identify denominator-eligibility individuals

As a result, QIP-NJ will be posting Standard Reporting Template (SRT) v2.3, SRT Guide v2.3, and Databook v2.3 with track changes capturing these updates to the <u>QIP-NJ website</u> early next week, along with updated slides from the May 10, 2023 webinar.

The QIP-NJ Team expects that the non-claims-based data submission window will open early next month, with submissions due approximately August 1, 2023 or two months after the release of attribution rosters, whichever is later.

MY 2 Attribution Reports

Hospitals can expect to receive MY 2 Attribution Reports early next week as well. As reviewed at the MY 2 Data Submission Webinar, and as described in greater detail in the QIP-NJ Governing Document, these retrospective reports are used to assign Medicaid Managed Care enrolled individuals to each hospital for inclusion in performance calculation.

Allow-listing Mailchimp for QIP-NJ Communications

The QIP-NJ team has recently started using Mailchimp for QIP-NJ outreach—which will enable more targeted communications to participating hospitals' stakeholders. While most of our participating hospitals have been able to receive QIP-NJ emails, some have not due to firewall rules. Please note that Mailchimp is being used only for cohort-wide QIP-NJ communications. To that end, individual, hospital-specific communications that contain sensitive information (such as Protected Health Information) will continue to be provided via direct emails or the Secure File Transfer Protocol (SFTP) site, as appropriate.

The QIP-NJ team has begun reaching out to hospitals that have not opened recent communications to request that affected hospitals work with their IT/security teams to "allowlist" (aka "whitelist") communications that are sent from QIP-NJ via Mailchimp. - DHS' Episode of Care (EOC) Pilot is a three-year pilot to test a new alternative payment model for prenatal, labor, and postpartum services statewide. More information regarding the EOC Pilot can be found on DHS' website at the link below. Performance Period 1 (15 months) of the EOC Pilot began on April 1, 2022 and will run through June 30, 2023. Performance Periods 2 and 3 (each 12 months) will run from July 1, 2023 through June 30, 2024, and July 1, 2024 through June 30, 2025, respectively.
