DOH Corner

We are now approximately one month away from the close of MY2 of QIP-NJ, which began on January 1st, and will conclude on December 31st of this year. As always, and especially with the holiday season around the corner, DOH continues to appreciate the dedication that all our participating hospital partners have brought and continue to bring to QIP-NJ. QIP-NJ would not be successful without all of your hard work and contributions.

This month's newsletter contains important updates regarding the finalization of MY1 performance calculations and payments, as well as the release of MY2 targets. In response to discussions with members of QIP-NJ's Quality Measurement Committee (QMC) and individual hospitals regarding MY1 performance as well as determinations to substantiate hospital appeals, DOH been working diligently with our colleagues at Public Consulting Group (PCG) to implement clinically appropriate measure specification and value set compendium (VSC) changes.

Due to the implementation of these changes and additional required calculations, the MY1 payment timeline has shifted, as described in this newsletter. Ultimately, DOH believes that the changes being made are in the best interests of individual participating hospitals as well as QIP-NJ overall. More details on the specific timing for various notifications and QIP-NJ MY1 payments are provided below. DOH again thanks all participating hospitals for their ongoing and continued partnership as we wrap up MY2 and look forward to MY3.

MY1 Claims-Based Measure Appeals Under Review

Each hospital received MY1 measure results and Patient Level Reports (PLRs) for all claims-based measures. DOH is actively reviewing claims-based measure appeals and hospitals will be notified of results in early December.

Update: MY1 NCB Appeals Results Distribution

The deadline for MY1 NCB appeals was October 14th. DOH is now actively reviewing appeals and anticipates the release of appeal results by mid-November.

MY1 Performance Results and Payment and MY2 Targets

As indicated in the DOH Corner above, the payment schedule for MY1 is shifting such that MY1 performance results and payment amounts, including guidance to Managed Care Organizations (MCOs) relative to MY1 payments as well as MY2 targets will be released in mid-January. As MCOs have 30 days to disburse funds to hospitals, DOH expects that all hospitals will receive MY1 funds by the end of the 1st quarter of 2023 (mid-to-late March 2023). Please note that there are many payment-related activities that must occur before payment is distributed, which includes but is not limited to: claims run out, performance calculations, hospital reporting periods, appeals periods, and the MCO transfer and distribution of payments.

Important: MY3 LOI Materials

For MY3 of QIP-NJ, DOH is using the same LOI process that was used for prior MYs. MY3 LOI materials were distributed earlier this month and require all NJ acute care hospitals to affirmatively respond indicating whether or not they intend to participate in MY3 of QIP-NJ. In confirming or declining participation, hospitals must acknowledge and agree to the set of conditions listed in the LOI materials. The LOI materials are available on the <u>Documents and Resources</u> page of the QIP-NJ website. Responses from hospitals are due **December 10**, **2022.** The LOI must be completed by an approved hospital representative and signed by the hospital Chief Executive Officer (CEO), Chief Financial Officer (CFO), Chief Medical Officer (CMO), or Chief Quality Officer (CQO). While the QIP-NJ LOI is a formal indication to DOH of a hospital's intention, it is not a legally binding document.

Update: QMC Meeting

Following the most recent convening of the QIP-NJ QMC, DOH invited QMC members to review additional codes for consideration in the VSC and Databook for MY3. Feedback from QMC members is being incorporated into the final MY3 VSC and Databook that will be disseminated in early 2023, pending CMS approval of the program design. Additionally, engaging with the QMC and stakeholders has enabled QIP-NJ to identify opportunity to make one-time retrospective changes to MY0 and MY1 that reflect clinically appropriate service capture that is consistent with measure specifications and will not introduce issues with CMS approval nor unintended downstream impacts.

Update: Pre-Print Development and Submission to CMS

DOH, in partnership with PCG and the Department of Human Services (DHS), submitted the Pre-Prints to CMS in late October. The most notable updates to the Pre-Prints for MY3 included adjustments to certain measure targets based on MY0 (baseline) evaluation findings, as discussed recently with the QMC. DOH/PCG will provide regular updates as our team works with CMS to secure necessary approvals.

- The NJ Maternal Care Quality Collaborative (NJMCQC) aims to achieve a significant and sustained improvement in overall maternal and infant morbidity and mortality rates statewide. The final public meeting for calendar year 2022 will be held on Tuesday, December 13, 2022. Additional meeting information will be published on the NJMCQC website as the meeting draws closer, so, please continue to check back regularly. DHS' Episode of Care (EOC) Pilot is a three-year pilot to test a new alternative payment model for prenatal, labor, and postpartum services statewide. More information regarding the EOC Pilot can be found on DHS' website at the link below. Performance Period 1 (15 months) of the EOC Pilot began on April 1, 2022 and will run through June 30, 2023. Performance Periods 2 and 3 (each 12 months) will run from July 1, 2023 through June 30, 2024, and July 1, 2024 through June 30, 2025, respectively.
